Classroom news:

Reception

Last week, the children in Reception made a very tasty soup with Mrs. Marroncelli, linked to the class topic of 'Healthy Me'. As Ms. Mangera didn't get to have any of the soup as she was out of class, this week the class wrote a shopping list for her so that she too could have a go at making the delicious sounding soup. The children also wrote



parts of the method for making the soup in their books and listed the cooking equipment Ms. Mangera would need.

KS1

This week in KS1 we have been locating the 7 continents on the world map and using an atlas in geography. In science, we have been comparing and grouping animals. In DT, we have started to make our animal finger puppets. Maths for Year 1 has been identifying coins and making different amounts with the coins up to 20p. If you are out and about in shops this weekend please let your child have a go at paying with coins. Year 2 has been adding and subtracting two digit numbers and starting to look at fractions of shape. Our Forest school sessions are approaching:

Year 3

Year 3 has had another busy week. In our English sessions, the children enjoyed listening to and composing their own ballads. In our maths sessions, the children continued to work on their quick recall of their 3-, 4- and 8-times tables. Please continue to practise these at home on Times Tables Rockstars. Later on in the week, we worked on problems that involved finding the inverse operation for multiplication and division problems. In our science sessions we continued to look at states of matter and thought about how to plan an investigation involving the melting point of different types of chocolate. In our geography sessions, the children had lots of fun writing a postcard based on their experiences in Antarctica.

Year 4

Well done year 4 for tackling so many different and challenging tasks this week. In English we really enjoyed another form of poetry called a ballad. Our most challenging activity of the week was trying to write quatrains for our own ballads. In maths this week, we have been exploring 3D shapes, and also practised counting along a number line in fractions, looking out for equivalent fractions. For science we have been learning how to read a thermometer by measuring the changing temperature of ice cubes through the day. The attached spellings this week include some words that will be useful for our topic as well as some words with the pattern -ation. We have also continued reading our class book *The Butterfly Lion* by Michael Morpurgo.

Year 5

In English, we compared different short stories by Shaun Tan, looking at the differences and similarities between them. We are also really enjoying reading the class anthology we created at the end of our poetry topic, with one poem by each child in the class. In maths, we started a unit on shape, sorting 3D shapes by their properties and identifying and drawing polygons. In science, we designed and carried out an investigation into friction, presenting our results on a bar graph. In PSHE, we are practising our communication skills, including listening, turn-taking and compromising.

Year 6

Year 6 have been finishing *Clockwork* (class book) and started *Alma*, a short animation in English. In maths, we have been doing mean averages. In computing we have been looking and improving games in Scratch. In history, we have been looking at historical sources. In science, we have been experimenting with Newton meters and what effects happen. Year 6 have been practising for their SATS for improvement. Finally year 6 has collected 100 stars.
