# Classroom news:

#### Reception

Reception have had a very positive start to this half term and the class really do look at home now. This week, we started our new class topic of 'Let's Celebrate', during which we will be finding out about the common features of celebrations from around the world. We will be starting off by looking at birthday traditions and the class already have so much knowledge about the subject. Who doesn't love presents and cake?

# Years 1 and 2

It's been lovely to welcome back all of KS1. We started the week by introducing them to their new topic The Gunpowder Plot. All classes thought about the time in history when Guy Fawkes was alive and the items that he would have used. In English, all classes have been looking at the features of recounts; writing in the past tense and using chronological order to record the events that have taken place in their day, and for the Year 2s to include powerful verbs and adjectives. All children practised writing up a recount of their day. In Maths, Year 1s have recapped subtraction and used word problems. In Year 2, the children have applied their number bonds to 10 and 20 and number facts to help them with working out adding single digits to 2-digit numbers. In Science, we've started looking at living, non-living and never been alive, to categorise objects and organisms. The children were given a range of objects to sort into these groups. Lastly, in PE, KS1 have been exploring different types of rolls and practised forwards roll, egg roll and a teddy bear roll. All ebooks have been uploaded to the Big Cat Portal. Well done for a hardworking week KS1!

#### Year 3

Year 3 have had a busy first week back after the autumn break. In our History lessons, the children enjoyed starting to learn about Ancient Egypt. They looked at photos of various artefacts and thought about what they might have been used for. In Maths lessons, the children worked on finding answers to division problems with remainders and doubling and halving numbers using partitioning. In English lessons, the children enjoyed listening to The Tiger Child by Joanna Troughton and various Indian Folk Tales contained in Seasons of Splendour by Madhur Jaffrey.

#### Year 4

In English, we have started reading *Grimwood* by Nadia Shireen and met some interesting characters. Alex wrote: 'The horrible cat has lost a claw and she's got beady, red eyes and the sharpest teeth in town.' Ayin described a cat that: 'has many scars from all her battles and extremely sharp hearing.' In Maths, we practised adding and subtracting money and finding the difference by counting up. We also began a new unit on multiplication and division. In Science, we did some practical work outside which helped us to explain about the different forces used in P.E. Please find attached this week's spellings.

#### Year 5

Year 5 have settled back very well after the half term break and have launched themselves into our new topics. In Maths, we are learning about equivalent fractions and simplifying fractions as well as comparing fractions with different denominators to decide which is greater. In English, we planned stories in a faraway place, inspired by The Cloud Tea Monkeys and wrote our first drafts. We focused on hooking the reader in through an interesting opening and writing techniques to keep the reader's interest throughout. We began our Geography topic, Deserts, by exploring the different biomes around the world and what makes a desert a desert. In Science, we discussed how to classify things using classification keys and how scientists classify different forms of life.

# Year 6

This week, we have been working on our Black History bioposters and some of us even showed theirs in assembly! This half term, we started a new topic on Deserts and finished our topic on Ancient Greece. We also created posters of different biomes such as the Tundra and the Savanna. We've started a new Science topic on classifying different species. On Thursday, we sorted and grouped different types of liquorice until all of them were in their own classification (there were 7 different types). We have started a new sport in PE which is netball, although we couldn't do it because it was very heavily raining so instead we played a class favourite – dodgeball. By Leon and Rupert
