Yesterday, the whole school celebrated World Book Day together. This year, we focused on illustrations and, as always, enjoying and sharing books together. We had an exciting assembly from illustrator and author Birgitta Sif, who showed us her amazing illustrations and talked about how she



sets out creating her work. Some of the classes also enjoyed reading her stories later in the day.

We also had a second assembly, which included a fabulous



fashion show, as it was our first 'dress up as a book character' WBD in four years! The whole school shared the start of the wordless book *Follow the Firefly* by Bernardo Carvalho and drew our own illustrations to show what could happen next in the story.

Classroom news

Reception

Reception has had an exciting week, thinking about their project-based learning on animals and enjoying a day devoted to World Book Day, thinking about the theme of illustration. In Phonics, the children have been exploring the sounds: 'er,' 'air,' doubling letters ending in 'er', such as "buzzer;" doubling letters ending in 'er,' 'in' and 'ish,' such as "rubbish;" and looking at longer words, such as "comic" and "fantastic." In maths, we have been exploring more of our number bonds to 10 and learning that when you swap the numbers around, it still makes 10, for example 6 + 4 = 10, and 4 + 6 = 10. In Literacy, Reception has continued with looking at the story book *Is There a Dog in This Book?* The children have been writing facts about an animal, remembering capital letters, full stops and finger spaces. Well done for a hard-working week Reception!

Year 1

Amongst all of the excitement of the World Book Day events this week, Year 1 has also enjoyed the more regular but also stimulating aspects of the curriculum. In art this term, the class is focusing upon various forms of mark making. The class has been working on skills with the aim to build up to creating shared pieces of art, which we hope to share with you later. Dance is our focus in P.E. and this half term we have been devising dances linked to our history theme of 'toys'. This week, the children were asked to imagine being stretchy toy figures, using long and wide shapes and springing back to the original form.

Year 2

This week, Year 2 has been working hard in maths, writing grouping and multiplication word problems. To finish the week, we moved on to our new money unit, where the children were recognising and finding totals using combinations of coins. In English, we wrote statements and questions inspired by *The Big Blue Whale* and finished the week by practising sentences with and, or, and but. World Book Day was a highlight! We loved seeing the costumes and hearing about favourite books. In geography, we identified and compared the North and South Poles. In art, we created a creative response to two artists who use watercolours. We ended a fantastic week with Forest School—well done for all your hard work!

Year 3

Year 3 has continued to work really hard on their play rehearsals this week. In our maths sessions, the children were introduced to some of the rules that are designed to help them to multiply and divide by 10 and 100. In our English sessions, we continued

to focus on poems written by Alex Wharton. The children learnt to recognise different poetic devices and say what was similar and different about the poems they read. In science, the children learnt to label parts of a flowering plant and explain their different functions.

Year 4

Well done Year 4. Our play is coming along well. You should have received an email with costume ideas this week. Well done to all the people who have been practicing. In maths, we have been adding 3 or 4 numbers and using written subtraction methods. In English, we have enjoyed a funny poem called *The Jumblies* and have looked at using commas. In science, we did an exciting experiment to see how plants affect soil erosion. In computing, we have been planning actions for our robotic pets. Spellings this week end in -ious or -eous. Please focus times tables practice on 7x.

Year 5

In English, we continued to read *Kensuke's Kingdom* and looked at how commas, adverbs and conjunctions make the writing flow better. We also revised other cohesive devices, including personal and possessive pronouns and possessive determiners. In maths, we learned how to divide 3-digit numbers by 1-digit



numbers using short division (bus stop method). We enjoyed the World Book Day celebrations on Thursday and our second Forest School session on Friday.

Year 6

This week in Year 6, we acted out a scene in *War Horse* (the book we finished last week). In history, we have been continuing our Tudors project which is a way for the teachers to challenge our independence by letting us pick what we do within the Tudor topic. We have also been preparing films for the 8th Annual Film Festival happening on Friday. PS We were very happy to welcome our new students, Taemin and Taeun.
