Classroom news:

Reception

Along with the dress rehearsals and actual nativity productions this week, Reception have been finding out about the story of Christmas and why Christians around the world look forward to the celebration. On a more day-to-day level, we have been working really hard to develop our handwriting, ensuring each letter is well formed and that there is an understanding of when to use upper case letters and when to use lower case. KS1

This week, the students in Key Stage 1 (KS1) have been quite busy with our Christmas production. As a key stage, we had a fantastic time performing for all of you. Apart from the festive activities, we have also continued with Reading and Maths assessments. Furthermore, all the students have been working on their "big writes" this week, where Year 1 has been rewriting the story of The Gingerbread Man using the talk-for-writing method. In Year 2, students have changed characters to create their own versions of the story. Additionally, some students in KS1 have been getting creative by making Christmas cards. In our Computing lessons this week, Year 1 students have been comparing traditional paintings with digital paintings. Meanwhile, Year 2 students have applied the photography skills they've learned this term to capture high-quality photographs and evaluate them. It's been an exciting and productive week for all of us! Please continue to support your child with reading the allocated online book. It is recommended that they read it at least 3 times on different days throughout the week.

Year 3

Year 3 have worked really hard throughout the week despite feeling tired after a long term. In English lessons the children completed their non-chronological reports about Ancient Egypt. In our Maths sessions the children worked on using doubling and halving to help them multiply and divide by 8. In our DT lessons the children used running stitch to complete their Egyptian collars. In Music lessons, the children have been practising their festive songs in preparation for the concert on Monday.

Year 4

Well done to Year 4 for an extremely hardworking and enjoyable term and wishing you all a happy, festive break. In Maths this week, we practised multiplication and division. In English and History, we researched Ancient Egyptian Gods and Goddesses, finished



writing our reports about Ancient Egypt and published our book of 'Grimwood Tales' for Year 3 to enjoy. In Music, we practised our songs for the Christmas Singalong on Monday afternoon. We are also looking forward to having a talk with Year 3 about Ancient Egypt by Dr Kate Spence from the Department of Archaeology at the University of Cambridge on Monday. Please see above some of the eye-catching Egyptian collars we have been sewing in DT. There will be no spellings attached this week.

Year 5

We had a busy week this week, spending a morning in forest school where we learned how to cut logs with saws and make tree decorations from twigs and string. We made pizzas, using our own designs, and then evaluated what went well and what could be improved next time. Our teamwork skills were excellent as we shared out ingredients and helped each other with chopping and preparing food. In Maths, we worked out the perimeter and area of both regular and irregular 2D shapes and then moved onto calculating the volume of 3D shapes. In English, we focused on learning poems by heart and performing them in different ways to an audience. We celebrated the end of the week with a handmade gifts Secret Santa, which was entirely child-organised and -led.

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have had a very busy week. We have been doing our practice SATS this week, which include 3 Maths tests, 2 or 3 English and Grammar tests and 1 Spelling test. Also, we have been doing science experiments with bread, seeing how mould grows on bread and where it grows best. This is the last full week until the holidays! So, the students have been deciding on a movie and if we do a Secret Santa. The Secret Santa is that students (who select to play) will give an edible present to a randomly selected person to eat during the movie that we will watch together.
