The weekly menu is attached. The menu after half term will be Week 1. The cost of a school meal is £2.50.


#### Classroom news

## Reception

Reception has had another very busy week this week. In phonics, we have looked at the phonemes: v, w, x and y and the tricky words; 'as', 'and', 'has' and 'his'. Reception practised writing out these graphemes and tricky words during handwriting. We have also started exploring symmetry using the hama beads to create symmetrical patterns. Reception also recapped the story *Maisy's Birthday* and during Active Learning, some of the children practised writing out the words, 'Maisy' and 'birthday.' In art, all children used wax crayons to create magical marks. Lastly, we finished the week with forest school, which all children really enjoyed as we made our way to the back of the school and the children collected more leaves and explored more of our beautiful forest. Well done Reception for a fantastic week!

#### Year 1

In geography over the past two weeks, Year 1 has been finding out about the use of maps. This week the class looked at the



difference between a ground level view and an aerial view. The pupils worked in groups to create 'messy' or 3D maps of the

classroom using everyday classroom resources such as counters and wooden blocks. Here you can see features such as tables and chairs and Ms Mangera's messy desk as seen from above.

#### Year 2

In Year 2 this week we have been looking at rhyming strings and writing poems about our favourite toy and what it means to us. We have enjoyed a maths investigation using addition and number facts. In science we have been looking at the characteristics of each animal group. As part of anti-bullying week we have role-played different scenarios that may happen in the playground and discussed at length what we might do. In history we have been thinking about toys that our parents and grandparents played with. Please check your child's Home Folder as they have written a letter to a family member asking lots of questions. It would be great if we could have some replies for next week's lesson. Thank you for your continued support.

## Year 3

Year 3 has worked really hard throughout the week. In maths, the children used their knowledge of inverse operations to find missing numbers (  $\underline{\phantom{a}}$  x 3 = 12). Later on in the week the children used partitioning (splitting numbers into tens and ones)



double and to 2-digit halve numbers. In the English, children continued to enjoy and write poems inspired by Michael Rosen. In history the children learnt Boudicca had risen

up against the Roman Empire. They thought of words that could be used to describe her appearance and personality. In our science lesson the children enjoyed gathering data about different food groups and displaying their findings in a range of ways. Year 3 also enjoyed forest school and recreated Iron Age style settlements together.

### Year 4

Well done year 4 for your hard work this week. In computing we have been spotting when AI may have been used because pictures don't look quite right. In **English** 

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have



performing poems by Michael Rosen and trying to write our own poem using rhyme. For history we have been discussing how reliable different evidence is when finding out about Boudicca's rebellion. In DT we have been designing and trying out ideas for building a castle. In maths we have been representing data in bar graphs and pictograms. We have also been interpreting the data to solve problems. For spelling this week we have been looking at more words ending in —ation.

#### Year 5

In maths, we began a new unit on multiplication and division, this week focusing on factors, common multiples, rules of divisibility and rounding answers with remainders up or down depending on context. In English, we practised converting between present and past tense and learned how to use the perfect tense. In science, we collected living things from around the school grounds and created a classification key to sort them by their characteristics. In PSHE, we discussed different types of bullying and compared which type different scenarios fell into.

### Year 6

This week Y6 has worn pyjamas twice. One for swimming (life saving lesson) and on Friday for Children in Need. We have been preparing for our restaurant next week. We have been doing lessons based on a book by Phillip Pullman (Clockwork).
