# **Classroom News:**

# Reception

We've had a super busy week! We started the week by discussing the fireworks event that many of our children attended on Bonfire Night. We also discussed how fireworks are used in other events such as Diwali, which took place just a few weeks ago and also during the Luna New Year/Spring Festival. Later on in the week, our class book was revealed as Happy Birthday, Maisy by Lucy Cousins. So much exciting learning has been planned around this, including organising our own party, which will involve writing shopping lists, cards and recipes. In Maths we have been learning about the vocabulary used when describing the length of objects.

# Years 1 and 2

This week, Years 1 and 2 have been comparing old toys from over 100 years ago, such as the first teddy bear, a Meccano toy and Crayola to the modern versions of these. The children thought about what was similar and different about these toys and how the very old versions had evolved over time. In English, we continued to look at the story Lost in The Toy Museum and Years 1 and 2 thought about how they could instruct the character, Bunting around the museum using imperative verbs and time connectives. In Maths, Year 1 have been looking at the properties of 3-D shapes and in Year 2, the children have been working on non-standard and standard forms of measurement, such as cm and (grams) g to measure length and weigh objects. In PE we've continued working on our gymnastic routine, building on the teddy bear roll and the tuck into a standing position. In Science, we've been using Venn diagrams to classify objects that are made from plants and not made from plants.

# Year 3

Year 3 started the week in Maths by doubling and halving 2digit numbers. Later on in the week, they learnt how to represent different lengths using metres and centimetres and ordered them according to their size. English lessons focused on the children taking effective notes in preparation for writing their own non-chronological reports on Romans. In our History session, the children learnt how to recognise different Roman settlements by looking at their name endings. In RE, the children enjoyed listening to My Name is Bob by James Bowen and Gary Jenkins and reflecting on what messages it taught them.

#### Year 4

In Science this week, Year 4 have had fun creating their own presentations about how we hear sound, complete with practical demonstrations. In English, we have begun independent research to prepare for writing nonchronological reports on the Romans and have discovered many interesting facts. In Maths, we have been learning how to accurately plot data onto line graphs as well as interpreting line graphs and what they show. We have also enjoyed our first forest school session of Year 4.

#### Year 5

Year 5 started their week off with a visit to Bletchley Park. We crammed so much into our 4-hour visit including a workshop about D-Day. This taught us about the deception of the British Army to trick the Nazi's into retreating from the coast of France, leaving Dunkirk free from protection. We also got to see, and have a go on, the Enigma machine - one of only a few hundred left in the world! We explored the sight including huts that the workers used and the mansion (below).

We also got to see a model of the Bombe Machine, used to decrypt Enigma's messages. Also, in class, we have started our new English unit on Reports by exploring migration of different animals. In Science, we set up an investigation to see which materials were best suited for taking part in sport.



As predicted, the modern sports material dried much quicker, and weighed much less, than traditional cotton t-shirts which we all agreed would be better for exercise. Don't forget that Year 5 have Bikeability in school next week from Monday to Thursday. Please make sure your child comes to school with their bike (in good working order) and their helmet.

# Year 6

This week we did a lot based on our restaurant. For Art we started making propaganda posters based on WW2. For Maths we worked on different methods for multiplying, eg column, lattice, grid and line method. In RE Mrs Marroncelli came in to observe us doing our new topic, which is Christians' beliefs about Christmas. In English we made a report about our trip to Bletchley Park and started our new book The Highwayman. In History we made letters about going to the countryside in WW2, writing from an angry perspective. *By Rose and Sóley*
