Dear parents/carers,

After showing some prospective parents around the school yesterday, highlighting all the wonderful stuff that makes Newnham such an easy sell, we stopped in the office for the usual Q&As.

One of the questions was about diversity and the school's approach to children with differing needs. I replied that, though understanding the current culture to identify and label needs, we tried not to use labels. That each and every child/adult in our community was as welcomed, equal and valued as any other and their wondrous variety celebrated.

My rather excellent, though woolly, answer led another parent to nod agreeably, arch an eyebrow and ask, pointedly, if and how we supported children who struggle.

It is a question whose answer I realise I take too much for granted and an answer that needs to be explicit to those not amongst our staff. So I thought I would be explicit here.

We are constantly helping EVERYONE. All the challenges different children face (being kind, playing with peers, understanding numbers, sports, reading, staying focused, staying awake, eating well, extending thinking etc. etc.) are discussed, dissected, analysed and possible solutions suggested, tried and tested by the staff.

Obviously, some children will need more support at different times, but ALL the children are always on the radar. To be honest, they are almost all we talk about!! It is the very essence of why we do our jobs.

It is a message that is worth being explicit about.

I hope you all have lovely (possibly stormy) weekends and we will see you all promptly (please) on Monday morning.

Classroom news

Reception

We've had another very busy week in Reception. In Phonics, Reception has looked at the sounds: z, qu, ch and plural words that end with an s, such as 'cats.' We also looked at the tricky words: 'go', 'no', 'to', and 'into.' In maths, we have been exploring symmetry and all children created symmetrical paper butterflies using paint and cotton buds. Reception were retold the story of *Maisy's Birthday* and completed some guided writing

about Maisy. Lastly, we had our second session of Forest School and all children enjoyed listening to the sounds around them,

such as the birds. Mrs spoke Bicknell to us about the different minibeasts that could be found and turned over logs to discover worms and millipedes and beetles. Well done for a great week



Reception!

Year 1

In computing, Year 1 has been using paint programs to create artwork. This week, we looked at the work of the artist Henri Matisse and how he used collage to create bright and stimulating pieces of art. Looking at an image of his 'Snail' we



recreate his work on the paint program. We were able to use tools such as shape outlines and the fill function in our digital

versions. Mouse control is quite tricky as many children are used to tracking pads on laptops but this is improving in each session.

Year 2

Year 2 has had a fantastic week full of learning and fun! We've been editing our poems and practising performance poetry, showing off our amazing oracy skills. In science, we've been sorting things into categories: alive, dead, and never alive—it's been fascinating! Art lessons introduced us to the world of mono printing and some great artists. In history, we enjoyed reading response letters from family members about their toys from the past. Together, we created a toy timeline for our display, carefully sorting the toys from oldest to newest. In maths, we've been spotting patterns in multiples of 2 and 10 and have even started doubling. Great job this week, Year 2!

Year 3

This week, Year 3 has continued to enjoy learning about the Romans. They learnt how organised and well trained their army was and enjoyed marching in small groups out in the playground.

In maths, we learnt how to recognise 2D and 3D by the number of sides and faces they had. Later on in the week, the children learnt to recognise different turns both clockwise and anti-clockwise. In English, the children learnt how to write direct speech correctly and how to join clauses together using a range of time related conjunctions. In computing, the children enjoyed planning their own animations.

Year 4

Well done Year 4 for your hard work this week. In English, we have been looking at speech punctuation and trying to write our own (interesting) conversation. For history, we have been finding out about life as a Roman soldier and trying to stay in formation while being attacked by Celts! In DT, we have been building 3d shapes from nets and thinking about which ones will be useful for building a castle. In maths, we have been representing and interpreting continuous data in line graphs. For spelling, this week we have been looking at words ending in –ly.

Year 5

In maths, we learned how to convert remainders into fractions and what we need to do with remainders in different situations (for example, leaving it as a remainder, dividing it to form a fraction or rounding it up or down). We then moved onto practising the grid method for multiplication and comparing it with short multiplication. In English, we planned, wrote and edited spooky short stories, inspired by those we read in *Short!* by Kevin Crossley-Holland. In science, we researched the scientist, Carl Linnaeus, and his taxonomy for classifying living things, then created informative posters about him. In PSHE, we looked at examples of indirect bullying and discussed the importance of not being a bystander.

Year 6

This week at Newnham Croft, we spent a lot of time planning our restaurant, as well as doing what we usually do; maths, English, geography and science. At times it was stressful but by working together, we have managed to create wonderful decorations for our restaurant. We hope you enjoy it!

In maths, I think that we made progress on our weekly tests, as we have learnt to divide fractions. In English, we have started to write the end of a suspenseful chapter of *Clockwork*. In geography, we wrote about the Alps and in PE we continued to practise tag rugby. So quite a good week!
