

Parent Survey June 2024

- Responses this year were from Ofsted’s Parent View. As a result, some questions that Governors ask did not have data collected this year. Data taken directly from Parent View are marked *, data that has been interpreted from Parent View is marked **. Questions not asked this year are noted in the table below. The school does not have access to the comments submitted to Ofsted.
- 105 responses were received (this compares with 101 in 2023, 111 in 2022 and 66 in 2021)


Summary of results

1. A very positive picture of parental satisfaction has emerged, with a significant increase in positive ‘strongly agree’ responses (see graph)
2. 99% of parents would recommend this school to another parent and 99% of parent agree/strongly agree that their child is happy at this school and that their child feels safe in school.
3. There is a strong positive picture around behaviour, with 96% parents agreeing/strongly agreeing that pupils are well behaved (up from 94% last year and 82% the year before). 73% of parents say that their child has not been bullied. Of those that say their child has been bullied, 67% say that the school dealt with it quickly and effectively (up from 55% in 2023 and 30% in 2022), with 18% of these parents saying that the school did not deal with bullying quickly and effectively (15% said that they did not know)
4. Parents are significantly more aware of what their children will learn during the year (98% up from 89% in 2023). 99% of parents say that their child does well at school (compared to 92% in 2023 and 84% in 2022), and 96% of parents say the school lets them know how their child is doing (up from 86% in 2023 and 75% in 2022)
5. The work on the curriculum is supported by parents, with 97% of parents saying there is a good range of subjects available to their child (up from 90% in 2023 and 86% in 2022) and that the school supports their child’s wider personal development (up from 89% in 2023 and 78% in 2022)
6. 100% of parents say their child takes part in clubs and activities at school (up from 90% in 2023), reflecting the work the school has done to improve wraparound care
7. There has also been a strong improvement in parents saying that when they have raised concerns with the school these have been dealt with properly (93% compared to 84% in 2023 and 61% in 2022).
8. Twelve parents said that their child has SEND and of these, 92% said that the school gives them the support that their child needs (up from 70% in 2023 and 63% in 2022).
9. An increasing number of parents say that the school has high expectations of their child (84% up from 72% in 2023 and 65% in 2022). There are still parents that say that the school does not have high expectations for their child (12% but this has improved on previous years: 13% in 2023 and 28% in 2022) and the number of parents that don’t know whether the school has high expectations of their child has dropped from 15% in 2023 to 4% this year.
