Reception and KS1 Christmas Concert

Classroom news

Reception

Reception has been particularly busy this week, not only preparing for Maisy's birthday party, but also rehearsing for the Christmas Concert and finally constructing crafts to make their classroom look very festive. All children have been practising songs and dance moves for the Christmas concert next week and have each been allocated with a Nativity costume. A big thank you to all of our wonderful Reception parents for making Maisy's birthday party so brilliant. All of the children looked brilliant in their party outfits on Friday afternoon. We watched all the birthday videos that the children had prepared at home with the help of their parents and we looked through the Birthday book, which is now filled with all of Reception's birthday photos from recent and past birthdays. There was even time for a little dance and some special birthday snacks. Well done Reception for an incredible penultimate week!

Year 1

In preparation for a Gruffalo party next week, the children in Year 1 have been reading and writing recipes. There are two recipes that we will follow. The first is called Terrible Tusks and includes

fruit on skewers, which we are sure that the children will enjoy. The second is called Mad Mud Pie and includes soil, leaves, twigs and stones, which is aimed more at the Gruffalo himself! The class has been finding out about the key elements of instruction writing including having a title, numbered instructions and pictures and labels.

Year 2

This week in Year 2, the children have had a wonderful time making their very own old-fashioned 'Cup and Ball' game. They

completed their final piece of instruction writing, showcasing all they've learned. Alongside this, we have been working end-of-term reading and maths assessments, there will be no new reading books uploaded to Collins Hub this week. In RE, we've been learning about Hanukkah, the exploring



traditions and the significance of the Hanukkah candles (Hanukiah). The children have also been busy rehearsing for next week's performance, and we are all looking forward to it! As a reminder, please ensure your child comes to school in a Christmas jumper on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday in preparation for the performances.

Year 3

Year 3 has worked really hard throughout the week on their end of term assessments. In maths lessons, the children continued to consolidate their understanding of how to add 3-digit numbers using partitioning (splitting into hundreds, tens and ones). In English the children enjoyed acting out and narrating scenes from *The Snowman* by Raymond Briggs. In our science lessons children learnt how to sort animals into vertebrates and invertebrates. They learnt about different types of joints and where they are found. Finally they looked at how our muscles work when we raise and lower our arms. Next week the children are looking forward to entertaining you with the Christmas Song they have worked on in music lessons. No spellings this week.

Year 4

It's been a busy week in year 4! It has been assessment week and everyone has worked hard. In DT we have added the finishing touches to our castle models. In maths we have practiced written methods for addition and subtraction. In English we have continued looking at *Grimwood* by Nadia Shireen. We have been practicing our oracy skills and writing a plan to deal with the horrible cat 'Princess Buttons'. We also designed our own science experiment to see how far sounds

travel. For spelling this week we have been looking at words where the 'ch' makes a 'sh' sound.

Year 5

In maths, we finished our unit on measures and data by exploring negative numbers in the context of temperature and how to calculate temperature differences. We also practised calculating the volume of 3D shapes and using the cubed symbol in our answers. In English, we wrote an application letter to apply for a travel grant to go on our imaginary travels to an Alpine region. We then began to write our travel pieces about our journey. In science, we continued to take regular observations of our bread samples as part of our mould growth investigation. In PSHE, we talked about the power that bystanders have when they see bullying and how to use that power for good.

Year 6

It was a great week in the Year 6 classroom. Y6 made some scrumptious-looking cookies for MasterChef this Thursday. We had a lot of interesting Arithmetic, Reasoning, SPaG and Reading tests. We enjoyed ourselves after knowing it was done.
