Classroom News:

Reception

It has been great to meet all of our new families this week and spend our first session together as a class. For the next two weeks, the children will be attending either morning (8.45 - 11.45) or afternoon sessions (1.30-3.15).

Years 1 and 2

It's been lovely to have all Key Stage One children back in and lovely to hear about their summer holidays. As a Key Stage, we've really enjoyed getting to know our new classes and have them settle into their new classrooms. We've introduced the children to their new topic 'Traditional Tales.' In English, we've started looking at The Three Little Pigs. We read the story and then we made story maps, using pictures and simple sentences to sequence the tale.

In Phonics, Year 1 have been recapping Phase 3 and Year 2 have been recapping Phase 5 and all children have been learning the new terminology for our new Phonics scheme. In DT, we have started researching different moving story books, based on our Traditional Tales topic, in preparation for making a scene from The Three Little Pigs using levers and sliders. If your child has any of these types books at home, please feel free send them in for us to explore. Well done Key Stage One for an excellent first week.

Year 3

Year 3 have had a really busy first week back. The class started off by learning about Stonehenge and used charcoals and pencil to sketch different aspects of it. In English lessons the children enjoyed learning and performing 'The Bug Chant' by Tony Mitton and writing their own stanzas containing rhyming words. In Maths, the children worked on placing 2 and 3-digit numbers on a number line and used the < and > signs to compare and order numbers. In spelling, the children learnt about some of the rules that apply to adding the prefixes -s, -es, -ing, -ed and -er to verbs. The children used google slides to create a profile of themselves and in history created a chronological time line of their own lives.

Year 4

Year 4 have had a brilliant first week back, opening our 'Invaders' topic with Stonehenge- inspired artwork. In Maths, we have been placing three and four digit numbers on number lines and practising place value, while in history we have been creating timelines of our lives. In English, we have been writing poems about animals, inspired by The Bug Chant by Tony Mitton. The class has been brilliant at working together in pairs and groups and we have had some very engaging class discussions.

Year 5

Year 5 have made an excellent start to the term, creating a class code which demonstrated maturity; the children have set themselves clear expectations about learning and behaviour and have made a really positive start to the year. We started our class story, A Medal for Leroy by Michael Morpurgo, and spent time predicting the plot and exploring the main characters. In Maths, we consolidated and built on our understanding of place value - using it to mentally add and subtract, order and compare 5-digit numbers.

Year 6

This week Y6 have been learning about WWI; we have learnt about Franz Ferdinand and the causes of the war. We wrote

a piece about the beginning of WWI in history and rewrote a scene from War Horse in English. This morning, we have focused on internet addresses in computing. We also played tag-rugby and compared it to the trenches and talked about warfare. *By Erik and Charlie*
