# **Classroom news:**

#### Reception

Our 'noticing' in Maths has continued into this week's learning. We spotted groups of 3 objects all around us and then played a game called '3 or not 3' on our smartboard. This is called subitising, when you can recognise a quantity without the need for counting and Reception are brilliant at doing this.

#### Years 1 and 2

We've had a very busy final week and everyone has worked extremely hard. In English, we've been looking at shape poems. Year 1 and some Year 2s chose to make a shape poem about the weather and the remaining Year 2s created their own shape poem. Year 1 filled in their shape poems with adjectives and vocabulary that related to their chosen weather, while Year 2 used sentences containing similes, alliteration and adjectives. In Maths, Year 1 have been exploring subtraction and they used concrete manipulatives to further understand this concept and then moved on to write subtraction number sentences. Year 2 have been adding amounts together using pence and then worked out change using subtraction. A very kind parent came in to run a session where we used computer software to analyse how well we could speak Ancient Greek. In English, we have been using the verb prefixes dis-, de-, mis-, over- and re- and the suffixes -ate, -ise and -ify, while in Maths we have been using vertical layout to solve division problems and the ladder method to solve multiplication problems.

This week in Year 6, we had a great time celebrating the end of our Ancient Greece topic. We had a miniature Olympic games and dress up afternoon, which was lots of fun. Last week, Daniel Zeichner came in for a questions assembly and Mrs Turner had given us a task to think of some good questions.
