Classroom news:

Reception

It has been a good first week in Reception, with children attending half-days so that they can gradually get used to the routines and expectations of being at school. There has been so much for them to find out and remember, from knowing where to place belongings, finding out where important



places are in the school and getting to know their new teachers and friends. Together we also talked about the class rules, which are quite simple really, 'Kindness: kind hands, kind words and kind feet'.

Years 1 and 2

This week in Geography, Year 1 and 2 have been looking at Google Earth and locating our school and local area. They have been labelling an aerial-view map of the school grounds. In Science, we have been testing simple physical properties of a variety of everyday materials. In English, we have been looking at using adjectives to make our sentences more interesting. In Maths, Year 1 have been practising writing numbers and partitioning teen numbers. In Year 2, they have been estimating and looking at place value of 2-digit numbers. The Collins eBooks are ready for you to start reading with your child; please let us know if you have any problems logging in. Also, please remember home folders and library books every Friday.

Year 3

Year 3 have had another busy week. In Maths, the children used their knowledge of hundreds, tens and ones to help add and subtract 3-digit numbers. In our English sessions, they started to learn about how to punctuate direct speech. Later in the week, we worked on recognising and using some of the powerful verbs found in I'll Take You to Mrs Cole by Michael Foreman. In our Geography sessions, the children enjoyed learning about how mountains are formed and using maps to identify where the world's highest mountain ranges are found. The Maths challenge and spellings are attached to this newsletter.

Year 4

In English, we have been learning about how suspense is built up in the Iron Man by using longer sentences, and how these contrast to shorter sentences that stop the reader and make them wonder. In Maths, we learned about place value to 10,000 and how to use time number lines to calculate time intervals crossing the hour. We also recapped how to convert from analogue and digital time to the 24-hour clock. We learnt about how mountains are formed in Geography and tested the permeability of rocks in Science. Year 4's official day to change their library reading books is Wednesday, although they are able to change their books more frequently if needed. Please find attached the Year 4 spellings to focus on this week and thank you for your continued support with your child's home learning.

Year 5

In Maths, we have been exploring the place value of 6-digit numbers and rounding to the nearest 10, 100, 1000, 10,000 and 100,000. In English, we have been learning about personal, possessive and relative pronouns, possessive determiners and relative clauses and writing our own sentences using these. In History, we planned our own minilessons and taught each other about different aspects of ancient Greek life, practising our live note-taking skills in the process. We enjoyed our trip to the Fitzwilliam Museum where we learned lots more about our ancient Greece topic through a range of different artefacts.

Year 6

This week, Year 6 have been doing a piece of writing on ancient Greeks' daily lives and we've also been working on our SATs practise tests. We have been doing our Percy Jackson comprehension in English. In DT, we made sandwiches for our Fitzwilliam school trip, where we are going to learn more about Ancient Greece. In Maths, we have been doing column addition and subtraction.
