Classroom news

Reception

Reception has had another very busy week. They have been looking at the spelling of longer words in Phonics ending in -er, -et and -en, such as "chicken", "carpet" and "ladder." In maths, Reception has started looking at 2D shapes. They looked around the classroom at objects which are rectangular, circular and squared. Reception also used 2-D shapes during Active Learning to create shape people. In PE, everyone used the gymnastics equipment, such as the benches and horses to safely walk across and jump down from, making sure that they remembered to bend their knees and land carefully on their feet. In computing, all children did some digital art, creating images of vehicles using the program 2Simple. Well done for a very hardworking week Reception!

Year 1

In geography, Year 1 has been looking at the local weather and found that there is so much more to weather than checking to see if it is just hot or cold and wet or dry. We set up a weather station outside our classroom and have been checking it each day this week. We checked the wind direction, which ties in with our knowledge of compass points, temperature, whether there has been any rain and weather what the conditions have been. From Monday to Friday there was no rain, the temperature ranged between OC and 10C, there were varied wind directions



and we had a range of weather conditions, from sunny to foggy but mainly cold!

Year 2

Year 2 have been writing their findings of their science experiment 'What do seeds need to grow?' and seeing if their predictions were right! In maths, we have been learning about fractions of shape and quantity, focusing on ½, ¼ and ⅓. In English we have continued writing our adventure stories based on the book *Grandads Island*. In history, this week we looked at primary sources to learn about Amelia Earhart and the journeys she took. In computing we worked on debugging algorithms. Please continue to support your child's reading at home - you can access their books through Collins Hub. If you have trouble logging in, please let us know. It is recommended that your child should be reading these at least 3 times a week.

Year 3

Well done to Year 3 on yet another productive week. In maths, the children used the expanded column method to help them add 3-digit numbers together. They also learnt how to use rounding to 100 to help them estimate their answers and use the inverse operation to check they were correct. In English, the children started to write up their non-chronological reports about a rare animal they have discovered living in the Amazon rainforest. They thought about the technical vocabulary they wanted to include and used a variety of conjunctions to link the clauses together. In science, the children used a range of different objects to create shadows and explored what happened when the distance of light source was altered.

Year 4

This week in science we looked at how different materials make different shadows. In our project, we presented our research



about rainforest creatures. We also produced some beautiful sgraffito artwork based on the leaf shapes we had collected.

In maths, we have looked at ways to sort 3d shapes using their properties and Venn diagrams. In English we have completed our own Grimwood style story, based on the animals we see from our classroom window. Molly wrote: 'While they snored, the towering trees covered them like a shelter.' Spellings this week are mathematical words.

Year 5

In maths, we practised finding unit and non-unit fractions of amounts and then applied these skills to word problems. We then learned how to find equivalent decimals and fractions for tenths, hundredths, halves and quarters. In English, we looked at the differences between the features of instruction and explanation texts and practised writing our own explanations for a fictional invention we made up. In science, we designed and

carried out investigations into how moon craters are formed, using flour and cocoa powder to represent the Moon's surface.

Year 6

In Year 6, we are learning about space. We have put up inflatable planets and made posters of the 'Phases of the Moon'. And in English, we did onomatopoeia pictures. In art, we are talking about perspective, drawing roads into the distance. This week, Mrs Turner gave an assembly about trusted adults.
