Dear Parents, Carers and Children

This week we had a meeting with our Education Welfare Officer; our school attendance is below national average and we have a higher number of persistent absentees than the national average. Under 95% is now considered as poor attendance (previously it was 90%) and persistent absence is now under 90% (previously 85%). We do recognise exceptional circumstance, particularly as we are such an international school, and also that children cannot help being ill or having other medical conditions. However unauthorised absences, such as term time holidays, may risk a penalty notice being issued against parents. We have 13 weeks school holidays per year so please make sure your family holidays are not during term time. Thank you for your support in improving our attendance figures and thereby children's learning.

Science Week

Over the last two weeks we have had a variety of scientists in school – thank you to all the parents who have given up their time to come in and share their expertise. On Wednesday Mr Goller led an assembly on women in science. He drew the attention of the children to Google images:

The children heard about Elizabeth Anderson, Diane Fossey, Marie Curie and Kalpana Chawla. Mr Goller suggested the children create a poster, leaflet or mind map with details of why people, especially women should become scientists.



During our science morning the children worked in their school council groups on an engineering task – building a bridge and a science investigation - water filtration. In one of the experiments (picture below), the children designed and created a water filter which they used to clean dirty water with. They learnt about how 2 million people per year die from water born diseases and that over one billion people in the world do not have access to clean water.
